 - 1 small pack of notebook paper in binder (place in notes section – you do not need a lot – you can replace throughout the year as needed!)

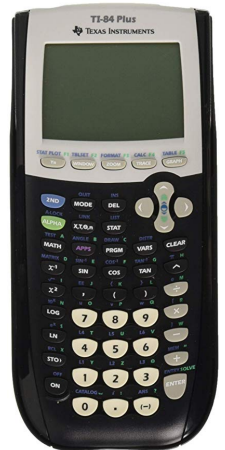
